A Potted History of St Michaels Church Hall



In 1954 a committee was formed at Frampton West to raise funds for a church hall of their own. Whist drives [very popular as a fundraiser at that time] in various people's homes were held, and it was anticipated that it would take five years to raise the funds.

After only two years, and loans from three local people, there was enough money in the kitty [shades of whist drives here] to buy the former Land Army hut, at Swineshead, which was up for sale. One half of it, perfectly big enough, was bought for £150. There is a picture in the hall of some of the Land Army girls who had used it at Swineshead. Fundraising continued and, with volunteers and a local builder, the hall was erected by the middle of 1956.

Ron Diggins and his Diggola provided the entertainment at the harvest supper that year. I am sure many people of a certain age will have memories of Ron Diggins, who actually invented both the mobile disco and the glitter ball. He came to St Michael's Hall again on further occasions.

Over the years, with lettings and fundraising, many improvements have been made to move with the times. The very draughty old windows were replaced with double glazing. The roof was renewed, and the fireplaces taken out. All of these things have helped towards making the hall warm and comfortable. The kitchen has been revamped with proper fitted units. The toilets were also renewed, and one which was accessible was added. Just over twenty years ago land was given to extend the car park next to the hall.

The hall is available for hire, at a reasonable rate, and is advertised in this newsletter each time. Over the years there have been celebrations held here for various royal events. Lots of children have had their birthday parties here, along with various family gatherings. Regular events have included dance classes, exercise classes, a coffee group, several clubs, etc. In recent years the number of people willing and able to be on the committee has dwindled considerably. I am sure that there are people reading this who have many fond memories of their time spent at St Michael's Hall. We would welcome new people, who may well have fresh ideas, to join us on the committee. It is not an overly onerous commitment as we only meet a few times each year.

10, 12 & 24 Sept, 11 October - High Tide Spectacles, with breakfast. Join our friendly guide on these gentle strolls around the reserve, timed to see

the best of the high tides this year. See the saltmarsh covered, sending hares, waders, and other creatures scurrying for refuge. The local birds of prey will gather, looking for an easy meal. Then its back to our visitor centre, for a breakfast bap and delicious cup of tea or coffee.

3 October - The Cuckoo's Lea: exclusive walk and talk with the author. Join naturalist and author of The Cuckoo's Lea, Michael J. Warren, for a guided walk around Frampton reserve. Refreshments will be served back at the centre, where Michael will give a short talk on the many birds in our placenames, before selling and signing copies of The Cuckoo's Lea.

16 October - Needle felted Pumpkin Decoration Workshop

Make a mini pumpkin for decoration for Halloween or an Autumnal display, with local fabric artist Jenny Wood. You will be shown how to create your pumpkin using a dry needle felting method, and using flat felt and hand stitched embroidery to embellish. All materials will be provided.

and damaged signs etc.

This is a very useful and efficient way of reporting issues.

When reporting you have the option to remain anonymous, however we would recommend completing the report with your details. It is usually worth taking a photograph of the issue you are going to report and uploading it to the site in support of the problem you are highlighting.

Alternatively, you can contact one of the Parish Councillors who can help you complete the report.

101 is an easy to remember number which can be used to contact your local police about crimes or concerns that do not need an emergency response.
