A Potted History of Hubberts Bridge.



The first and possibly the most important thing to get straight about Hubberts Bridge is the origin of the name. So, a Mr. Robert Hubbert who died in 1850, was enterprising enough to construct a wooden turnpike crossing across the South Forty Foot drain. Charging vehicles such as they were to cross, this bridge was rebuilt in 1850, and remained in place until 1888, when it was replaced by a brick bridge, funded by the then local authority.

So, the conclusion as to the origin of the name of the village can be deciphered from the construction of the bridge by Mr Hubbert, Hubberts Bridge.

The arrival of the railway in 1859 and subsequent station was the next catalyst for the Village, house building along Station Road, and the erection of the warehousing behind the Wheatsheaf put the village on the map. The ages of houses along Station Road would date the arrival of the railway.

Of course, the railway and station allow residents of the village to travel the whole world from little old Hubberts Bridge. An example of this would be the departure from Beijing by a one-time resident of the village, via the Trans-Siberian Railway, through Ukraine, Europe, the channel tunnel and all the way to Hubberts Bridge.

How would Mr Robert Hubbert have reacted to such a journey.

The train visits Skegness, Wainfleet, Boston, Hubberts Bridge, Swineshead, Heckington, Sleaford, Rauceby, Ancaster, Grantham, Bottesford, Bingham and Nottingham.
